- One picture or drawing

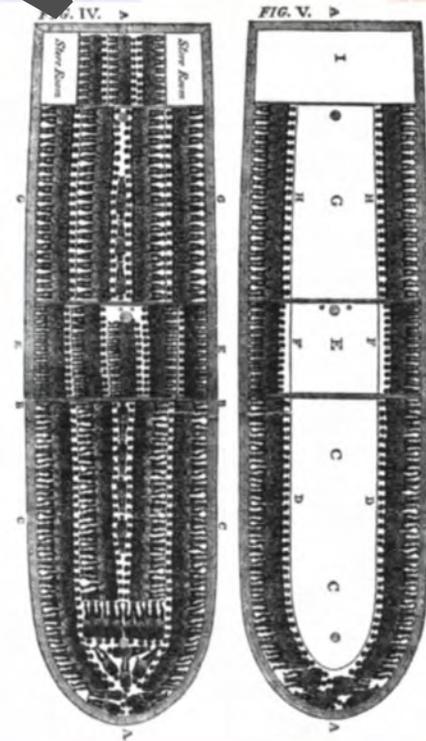


# Middle Passage Acrostic Poem

- 2 recommendations/quotes by other people



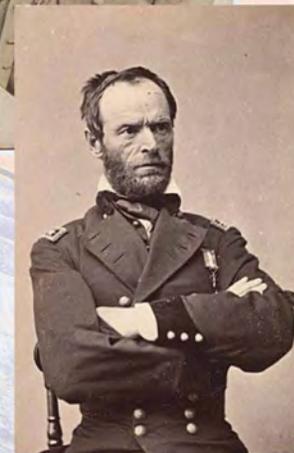
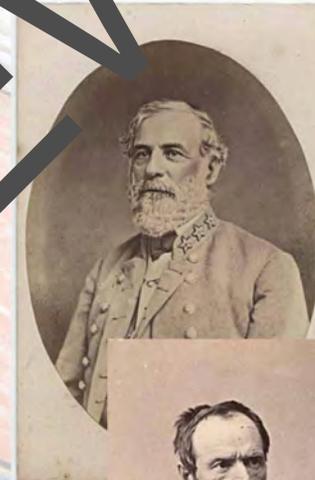

# Social Media Assignment

## What is X?

"X" (formerly Twitter) is an online social networking site that enables users to send and read short messages (tweets).

## Assignment:

You must use the template provided to create an X-style feed/page for a certain person. Your goal is not only to demonstrate your knowledge of the material but also to reflect this in a creative manner.

Your Twitter page must include the following:

- **Header Image:** A header is a large attention-getting image placed across the top middle of the page. What header image might this person use? (Think about important events, causes, or beliefs.)
- **Profile Picture:** What picture or icon might this person use as his or her profile picture?
- **Name:** Who or what is the account about?
- **Handle:** What would this person choose as his or her username? (This should be unique and related to some aspect of the person's life or interests.)
- **Brief Bio/Description:** Give a brief biographical summary of who or what the page is about. You can also include a job title or hashtags that describe this person. This area can be no longer than 160 characters.
- **Website:** If this person had a website, what would it be called?
- **Posts:** A post is a short message that is no longer than 140 characters. What would this person say? What would he or she talk about on his or her page?
- **You Might Like:** Which people or other accounts might the site suggest this person follow? Give a picture/icon, name, and handle for each.
- **What's Happening:** The "What's happening" box contains topics that are very popular at the moment. What would be the important topics of the time period in which this person lives? A trend must begin with a "#" and contain no spaces between words. (Examples: #civilwar, #ilovechocolate, #historyisawesome, #georgewashingtondeath).

\*\*\*Read the assignment to see if there are specific items or facts that must be referenced in your page.
